All children in McHenry County from birth to age 5 have the opportunity for regular early childhood developmental screenings.

Parents learn about developmental milestones and how to support their child's learning.

Children are identified early to receive supports and services they need to be successful.

Parents receive a referral if the need for further evaluation is indicated.
